"The three circles in the spirit of sound represent Music, Dance and Mother Earth. Three things that are incredibly important to my culture and all intrinsically connected. The lines connecting the circles represent the connection between music, dance and mother earth and passing down of knowledge between generations."

"I'm very proud to work with Hearing Australia to highlight the importance of sound to myself and to Indigenous people. When we hear sound it travels through our ears into our bodies and wakes up our feelings. In this book you can see the spirits of sound and how it moves around like a message being sent. When we start to listen we can start to learn."
